



2020 Oodgeroo Noonuccal Indigenous Poetry Prize

QPF are very proud to again present Australia's only open-age Indigenous poetry prize for an unpublished poem of 80 lines or less. Named in honour of Oodgeroo Noonuccal, the first Aboriginal Australian to publish a book of verse. This award has been named after receiving permission from Oodgeroo's family and in close consultation with Quandamooka Festival.

The Oodgeroo Noonuccal Indigenous Poetry Prize is open to all Indigenous poets, emerging and established, throughout Australia.

1ST PRIZE: \$2,000

Highest Quandamooka entry: Performance opportunity at Queensland Poetry Festival 2021

The winners will be announced at the Queensland Poetry Awards on Friday 31 July 2020.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What does '80 lines or less' mean?

A: Each entry must be 80 lines or less in length. The line count does NOT include the poem's title or section titles within the poems.

Q: Are published poets eligible to enter?

A: Yes, so long as the entry itself has not been published or is on offer for publication.

Q: Can I enter a 'suite of poems' as a single entry?

A: You may enter any number of poems as a single 'suite of poems' provided that the total number of lines does not exceed 80. If you have a number of totally unrelated poems you must enter them separately

Q: What about copyright?

A: Copyright of all poems (including the winning poems) will remain with the author.

Q: Will I get any feedback from the judges?

A: No. Judges will comment only on the winning poems.

Rules

1. Entrants must be residents of Australia as of the date of entry. This prize is open to Indigenous people only.
2. The Quandamooka highest place entry is open to Quandamooka people only.
3. The poem must be the entrant's original work.
4. The poem must be unpublished and not on offer for publication elsewhere up to and including 31 July 2020.
5. The poem must not exceed 80 lines in length.
6. Entrants may submit more than one poem (or suite or poems), but each entry must be accompanied by a separate Entry Form.
7. Entrants may submit poems in language (accompanied by an English translation of the poem.)
8. Use a serif font (e.g. Times New Roman) in 12-point type, 1.5 line spacing on single-sided white A4 papers.
9. Entries will not be returned. Entries will be acknowledged by email only.
10. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
11. As the poems are judged anonymously, your name must NOT appear anywhere on the poem.
12. Entries must be submitted using the online application form at www.queenslandpoetryfestival.com
Upload your poem (as a PDF or Word doc) and complete the online entry form at the QPF website
13. Entries must be received by **5pm Monday 27th April 2020**. Late entries cannot be accepted.
14. Winners and highly recommended may be required to provide a Confirmation of Aboriginality Form
15. Winners will be advised in July and announced at the Queensland Poetry Festival on 31 July 2020
16. Entry to this award is FREE of charge
